

Hand of the Month Aunt Lucy

'hear stories about somebody's "Aunt Lucy" who plays bridge and knows every card before the play begins. Of .course, nobody – Aunt Lucy included – knows every card. But she can show you how to discover most of declarer's 13 cards even before the opening lead is made. And maybe all 13 – declarer's complete hand pattern – even before you play.

Example:

Aunt Lucy, sitting *East*, in fourth seat holds:

♦Qxx ♥10xxx ♦Axxx **♣**Kx

The bidding:

Partner North South Aunt Lucy Pass Pass 1NT Pass Pass

A pretty simple auction, huh? Now's the time to ask yourself what you know. Those bored or asleep know nothing. But Aunt Lucy, using her mental blackboard, is thinking: "Since South rebid notrump, he probably has some length in all four suits – no singletons or voids (or long suit of six or more)."

Begin the Questions

It's time to use some simple arithmetic:

- How many total cards does *South* hold?
- Thirteen? yes, very good.
- What are they?

You don't know? I think Aunt Lucy does.

She about to use simple logic to count his hidden hand, assuming declarer is reasonable and owns a balanced hand to rebid notump – probably no short suits (0-1), or long suits (6+).

Here's what we think Aunt Lucy already knows about Declarer's Hand Pattern:

Begin the Count

Reflection: How many of each suit does declarer have?

- How many spades does *South* have, 0-1? No. Does he have 2? Yes, for sure, a truth! Does he have 3? Maybe. Does he have 4? No, he'd bid 1♠ over 1♥, if he's a good partner.
- How many hearts, 0-1? No. Does he have 2? Yes. 3? Maybe. 4? No, he would have raised partner.
- · How many diamonds? Well, he must have a four-card suit somewhere. And since he opened the bidding with 1♦, and we've learned he shouldn't have four hearts or four spades, he must have four diamonds - a truth. Can he have five? Maybe, but not six; he would rebid 2.

How many clubs? 0-1? No. 2? Maybe (3-3-5-2). Does he have 3? Maybe. 4? Maybe. Does he have 5? No, he probably would have rebid $2 \clubsuit$ if he was 42 - 4 - 45 (or opened $1 \clubsuit$).

So, here is what Aunt Lucy knows about Declarer's hand:

	Truths (10)	Maybe (3)
Spades	2	3
Hearts	2	3
Diamonds	4	5
Clubs	2	3 or 4

efore the first card is led, she already "sees" 10 of declarer's Before the first card is led, she also knows 13 cards (the "truths:" ♠-2, ♥-2, ♦-4, ♠-2). She also knows the three missing cards can only be one each of all suits except clubs, which could be two if declarer is 2-2-4-5 and opened 1.

Now, if you pay closer attention to the opening lead from your partner, while thinking in both suit patterns and hand patterns, you should be able to locate one, two or even all three missing cards. At trick one partner leads the \$2 (playing fourth-best opening leads). You see the dummy which has, 3-4-3-3 distribution.

♦Kxx ♥Jxxx ♦Kxx **♣**Qxx

Now look at Lucy's hand (at the top) which is 3-4-4-2. If, from the \$2 lead, partner has exactly four spades, dummy has three, and you have three – then declarer also has three! Spades are 4-3-3-3. Now you know 11 of 13 hidden declarer cards before the first play is made from dummy (he's 3-2-4-2 and 2 unknown).

The Final Count

The last clue: Now look at the club suit – three in dummy and you have two - eight missing. Declarer probably does not have five or would have bid them. Partner doesn't have five or he would have led one. The missing 8 clubs must be 4-4. Declarer's hand pattern is 3-2-4-4 – you now know all 13 cards!

Maybe Aunt Lucy was clairvoyant. Or maybe she learned to count in hand patterns and suit patterns. The true way to play.
